

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

On behalf of The Women's Centre, I am pleased to present this Annual Report, outlining our 2019-2020 successes and learnings.

Last year, the number of shelter stays increased by eighteen per cent and we saw a three per cent increase in crisis and support calls over the year before. This is bittersweet as it means we were able to help

more women, but also makes it obvious that abuse and violence continue to persist in our community.

We were able to address the increased demand thanks to the generosity of the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, individuals, foundations and local businesses who continued to support our vision where women and children live in safety. Our dedicated volunteers helped us tackle many projects including painting, landscaping and various fundraising activities. In June 2019, our new board of directors was elected and have since provided leadership and governance. Several staff members celebrated milestones last year, including Kathie Cole who has been with us for twenty five years and Patricia Oxberry who joined the team fifteen years ago. We were sad to see Madeline Sanagan leave for a career with Parks Canada, but wish her well in this amazing opportunity.

COVID-19 has forced us to adjust operations within the shelter but thanks to our staff's fortitude and the community's generosity, the transition has gone smoothly and we are well-positioned to begin our next fiscal year.

Thank you for your involvement with The Women's Centre Grey Bruce. I look forward to another year of working together to eliminate abuse and violence so that women and children can live in safety regardless of their circumstances.

OUR SERVICES

The **Shelter** is a twenty bed facility with security and main floor accessibility offering twenty-four hour crisis intervention, supportive counselling and transitional housing.

Walk-in crisis support is available twenty-four hours per day at the Shelter and during business hours at Second Stage.

Trained staff provide telephone **support, information and referrals** for women in crisis, twenty-four hours per day.

Individual and group counselling is available at the Shelter and Second Stage, for all women regardless of their situation.

The **transitional outreach** program assists women living in Second Stage and those from the community, connect with local support and services.

Second Stage Housing is a safe ten-unit townhouse complex that provides transitional and supporting counselling within a geared-to-income rent program.

Public education about abuse and women's issues is shared with community partners including schools, faith groups and service clubs.

Family court support is provided in partnership with other community agencies to support abused women and men while they navigate through the Family Court system.
